The position provides technical expertise in the areas of energy efficiency and renewable energy to AEA clients and staff. Specific activities vary depending on the programs and services AEA is delivering.

REGIONAL ENERGY PROJECT COORDINATOR Fort Simpson

Located in **Fort Simpson**, the Regional Energy Project Coordinator reports to the Executive Director and works together with the AEA team, with a focus on delivering AEA programs in the communities in their region. The Project Coordinator's role is to assist and support NWT individuals, businesses, institutions and communities to implement projects that reduce their energy costs and related greenhouse gas emissions. The Project Coordinator liaises with appropriate AEA staff for advice, consultation and completion of community projects.

All positions involve travel to NT communities in the regions (by air and/or winter road).
